TSCA 6(h) STATEMENT EPA-HQ-OPPT-2019-0080, 40 CFR Part 751

Re: Toxic Substance Control Act (TSCA), Document Citation: EPA-HQ-OPPT-2019-0080, 40 CFR Part 751 effective date February 5, 2021.

To: All Peter Paul Electronics Company, Inc. customers

The Peter Paul Electronics Company is aware of the Toxic Substance Control Act (TSCA) as noted below. To the best of our knowledge, none of the five PBT chemicals under TSCA section 6(h) listed below are present in Peter Paul Electronics products above the 1% of weight maximum allowable.

The Frank R. Lautenberg Chemical Safety for the 21st Century Act, enacted on June 22, 2016, includes a provision under TSCA section 6(h) requiring EPA to take expedited action on specific PBT chemicals to address risk and reduce exposures to the extent practicable. EPA identified five PBT chemicals for expedited action in 2016, following criteria outlined in section 6(h) of TSCA and issued a proposed rule in 2019. EPA issued final rules on January 6, 2021.
